IN DIRECTION.




KEEP A WATER SUPPLY AND SHOVEL CLOSE TO THE BURNING SITE.

ATTENDANCE
UNTIL THE FIRE
IS OUT.

LANDSCAPE DEBRIS PILES
MUST BE IN SMALL, 4-FEET
BY 4-FEET PILES.



CLEAR ALL FLAMMABLE
MATERIAL AND VEGETATION
WITHIN 10-FEET OF THE
OUTER EDGE OF PILES.





NO HOUSEHOLD TRASH OR GARBAGE CAN BE BURNED OUTDOORS AT RESIDENCES.



DRY, NATURAL VEGETATION, GROWN ON THE PROPERTY CAN STILL BE BURNED OUTDOORS IN OPEN PILES, UNLESS PROHIBITED BY LOCAL ORDINANCES.





DON'T BURN IF IT IS WINDY AND THE SURROUNDING VEGETATION IS VERY DRY.

BERMITS

BURNING CAN ONLY BE DONE AFTER OBTAINING REQUIRED PERMITS FOR PERMISSIVE BURN DAYS. CHECK BURN DAYS BY CONTACTING YOUR LOCAL FIRE DEPARTMENT.
