

HUNTING FIRE SAFETY

As you prepare for your hunting trip, make sure you do your part to ensure you do not start a unwanted wildfire.

- Never leave your cooking or warming fire unattended.
- Remove branches to make sure you have enough clearance above and around your fire. Fires built at the base of a tree can burn into roots and smolder for days before torching out and becoming an unwanted wildfire.
- Keep your fire to a manageable size. A large fire requires more work and water to ensure it's dead out. That's less hunting time!
- Drown your fire with plenty of water and dirt. Stir to make sure everything is wet and muddy. If water is not available, stir in cool dirt and smother the fire to remove heat.
- Most importantly, ensure it is cold to the touch before leaving.
