- The Coloring Book Division is open to all grades, K-12, and will be open for 2021 only.
- The winners' artwork will be featured in a special coloring book to commemorate Keep Montana Green's 75th anniversary.
- All submissions must be in black and white and should be easy for someone else to color.
- You may submit a color version of your artwork to your regular division, but you will only be eligible to win a prize in one division.
- Coloring Book Division entries will only be judged at the state competition.

Objectives:

- Educate Montana's youth on ways to reduce human-caused wildland fires;
- Assist educators with teaching fire safety and prevention;
- Utilize ideas and messages from the art contest in future fire prevention programs.

Entry Deadline: February 26, 2021 Theme: Keeping Montana Green

Contest Rules:

- Artwork will be judged on originality, design, slogan, artwork, and prevention message
- Entries must follow the wildland fire theme
- Contest is open to Montana Students in grades K-12
- Slogans should be clear, brief, and positive
- There is no paper size requirement
- Organization and agency logos and copyright characters such as Smokey Bear may not be used
- Use sturdy papers, such as cardstock or construction paper or mount on mat board
- Artwork becomes property of Keep Montana Green and may be used for publicity purposes
- Participant's name, grade, school, school phone number, school address, teacher's name and email, and parent's email should be included

Audio Visual Division:

Videos or sound clips are acceptable in this division. Examples include music, TV commercials, news stories, radio advertisements, public service announcements, educational material or social media products.

- Video and audio clips need to be 30 seconds or less
- Students can use any public domain footage, photos and music
- Copyright materials can only be used with written permission
- Video entries must be uploaded to YouTube or Vimeo
- All content must be PG or G
- All participants must email kristin.sleeper@mt.gov an mp3 file as an attachment or a link to their video by February 26, 2021

Judging:

Artwork will first be judged regionally by the six Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC) Land Offices. Ribbons will be awarded to the first three places in each division. These winners will be announced by their regional land offices and their artwork will advance to the statewide competition. All participants will receive a Certificate of Participation. Audio Visual, Computer Generated and Special Education Divisions are only judged statewide.



Fire Prevention Tip: Spring is in the air! Prune tree limbs so the lowest branches are 10 feet above the ground to help reduce the chance of wildfire burning into the crowns of your trees. These lower branches and shrubs are called ladder fuels.



Fire Prevention Tip: When open debris burning is allowed, establish wide control lines around brush piles and fields. Make sure to obtain a permit and let your local fire department know when you burn. Don't burn on windy days. Keep your burn piles small and keep water near at hand. Never leave your fire unattended.



Fire Prevention Tips: Clear off pine needles, dead leaves, and anything that can burn from your roof, gutters, and decks to help prevent wildfire embers from igniting your home. Rake leaves, pine needles, and debris from your yard.

Fire Prevention Tips: June is a great time to make sure yard equipment, trailers, farm equipment, and off-road-vehicles are in working order. Check spark arrestors, wheel bearings, exhaust systems, frayed belts, and exposed wires. It only takes one spark for a wildfire to start.



Fire Prevention Tips: Lawn and farm equipment-caused wildfires are common this time of year; just one small spark can ignite dry grass. Your local firefighters are asking you to be cautious while operating equipment. To avoid starting a wildfire, inspect and maintain equipment, avoid parking or driving in tall grass and make certain you have water, a fire extinguisher and shovel with you.

Fire Prevention Tips: Be careful with outdoor repair work that includes metal cutting saws, grinders, and welding equipment. Before starting your project clear vegetation and water-down the work area, especially downwind. Re-water the area periodically to keep it wet until repairs are done.



Clear away flammable material, do not build your fire underneath tree branches, never leave your fire unattended and make sure you have plenty of water to put your warming fire out completely.



Fire Prevention Tips: Removing flammable plants helps reduce your homes risk of ignition from wildfire. Trim back any shrub or tree branches that come closer than 5 feet to your house or outbuildings. Remove any overhanging branches.


