

# WELCOME

We all know this fire season has been one for the record books. Our hearts go out to those in California, Oregon, and Washington as they grapple with historic wildfires, mass evacuations, and harmful smoke. We Montanans count ourselves lucky for having so far avoided any catastrophic wildfires. However, wildfire is a global threat requiring solutions from everyone. Climate change and forest management are two major causes of the rise of wildfire severity and frequency, but there is a third cause – us.

In Montana, two out of every three wildfires are caused by people – by debris burns, campfires, and equipment sparks getting out of control. As more people move into the wildland urban interface and recreate on public lands, human-caused wildfires are becoming more and more common. However, we can take solace in that such wildfires are easily preventable. Plan ahead for your debris burn by checking for fire restrictions and obtaining a permit. Keep your campfires small and drown them until cold to the touch. Keep your lawn, farm, and ranch equipment clean and well maintained. Do not park or drive on tall dry grass. Inflate your tires and cross hitch chains to prevent anything from dragging while towing. It only takes one spark to start a wildfire!

The most important impact we can have on our communities is educating our children on wildfire prevention. Keep Montana Green treasures our annual Wildfire Prevention Art Contest, which engages almost 3,000 youth every year, and fosters a culture of public land stewardship in the next generation. We invite all Montana students, K-12, to participate by creating works of art that promote public awareness of wildfire. To celebrate Keep Montana Green's 75th Anniversary, we have doubled the prize money for statewide contest winners, created a NEW Coloring Book Division, and established overall 2nd and 3rd place positions for the statewide contest. #### EDUCATOR HIGHLIGHT: BECKY SULLIVAN



For Becky Sullivan, wildfire prevention is personal. Once a resident of Barstow, CA, Becky experienced the impact of large wildfires firsthand. "The schools closed because of too much smoke,"

she said. This got her wondering why large fires had to happen, and more importantly what we can all do about it. Becky is celebrating her 35th year as an educator and has taught everything between kindergarten and 8th grade. Originally from Minnesota, she grew up enjoying her family's cabin on the lake. She earned her Bachelor of Arts from Concordia College and her master's from the University of Phoenix. Now she lives with her husband, a fire management officer, in Laurel, MT. She began at Fred W. Graff elementary in 2013 as an aid, but secured the position of art teacher once that opened. She now teaches art to 800 students between kindergarten and 4th grade. Becky is proud to tell you she has had at least one winner in the Wildfire Prevention Art Contest every single year since she began. This year she had three winners at the statewide competition! "I just love when we get art from Laurel." she has been told when she submits her students' artwork to the DNRC Southern Land Office. Becky inspires her students to participate in the contest, not only by presenting the opportunity to her classes, but by teaching fire prevention lessons. She shows Smokey Bear educational videos, videos on cleaning up debris from around the house, and highlights the artwork from previous art contest winners. Not only that, but she celebrates her school's winners with gifts of art supplies to encourage them to keep up with their passion for art. "The kids get really excited about the art contest," Becky said. "They get inspired by their own camping trips and the videos on wildfire."

## EDUCATOR HIGHLIGHT: KATE DANIELS

Kate Daniels is another teacher who taught three winning students from the 59th Annual Art Contest Statewide Competition. In fact, we had five teachers have three or more statewide winners in their classes! Here is her Keep Montana Green story in her own words:

Green is one of my favorite colors. Growing up in the verdant state of Vermont gave me a love for the outdoors. I grew up hiking and trail riding in the rolling hills of the east and moved west over twenty years ago to explore the more rugged mountains of Montana. Now,



my husband Matt and I are enjoying new adventures hiking, biking, skiing and playing hockey with our two children, Tilly (12) and Alex (g). I also try to bring that love of the outdoors to my classroom at Columbia Falls High School where I have been teaching art for ten years. The Keep Montana Green Poster Contest is one way I make a cross-curricular connection with students each year. The contest reinforces the power of art to convey a message while giving the class an opportunity to discuss the causes of wildfires. Anyone that has lived through an active fire season in Montana can relate to how fire impacts the environment, wildlife, and our everyday lives. Wildfires resonate with us all and bring up different mixed emotions of a missed football season, a favorite hunting location lost, or of the smell of smoke-filled days. Students with successful entries combine those feelings with prevention messages to create a persuasive visual piece of art. The contest also gives the community an opportunity to see student artwork displayed online at the Keep Montana Green website and in the annual KMG calendar. I encourage all grade levels to participate in the contest and showcase their individual skills. The best way to engage students in this contest is to go to the

Keep Montan Green website and review the work of past contest winners. There, students can find a gallery of successful entries. From the website, students get ideas and realize that they, too can make a cool poster. This leads to brainstorming and discussing the reasons why 60% of wildfires are human-caused. My criteria for the assignment are three straightforward things: 1. identify the message you want to create visually; 2. state the yearly slogan; and 3. use artistic choice and skill to create a well-crafted poster. Columbia Falls students never cease to amaze me with their talent, hard work, and dedication to things that they believe in. This is why my students place in the contest each year. The poster contest gives them the opportunity to share their artistic vision to Keep Montana Green with their community and the state.
